Ongoing Programs

- Offering grants to small and medium-sized enterprises through Kesennuma Chamber of Commerce and Industry.
- Building new offices for two fishing cooperatives serving over 600 members in Minamisanriku.
- Targeting the elderly to make sure their needs are met and to include them in rebuilding and recovery efforts.
- Clearing debris and mud from cities and ports.

Evacuation Shelter Assistance

- Over 160 tons of relief supplies distributed to more than 28,000 survivors. Supplies include food, water, clothing, blankets, sanitary items, heaters and kerosene.
- Satellite phone system for survivors to contact loved ones.
- o Medical check-ups coordinated with hospital in Kanagawa.
- Bath-house constructed in Ofunato.
- o Free shuttle buses provided for shopping.

Transition into Temporary Housing

- Household supplies already distributed to over 20,000 survivors.
 Supplies include pots, pans, plates, bowls, cups, eating utensils, bedding, emergency kits, and sanitary items.
- o Gardening kits delivered to adults and elderly.

Economic Recovery Programs

- Provided office equipment and supplies to local Chambers of Commerce and Industry.
- Supported "mobile markets" by providing trucks to shop owners.
- o Reopened fish markets in Minamisanriku and Ofunato.
